As the principal contractor we must: Plan, manage, monitor, and coordinate the entire construction phase Take account of the health and safety risks to everyone affected by the work (including members of the public), in planning and managing the measures needed to control them Liaise with the client and principal designer for the duration of the project to ensure that all risks are effectively managed 	Conor Barwise; Joe Murphy
